Luke 1:26-38

Daily Growth

CELEBRATE: What can you praise God for from this passage? CONFESS: Are you convicted of something you need to confess to God?

COMMIT: What commitment does this passage challenge you to make? COMMUNICATE: What did you learn that you can share with someone?

- Day 1: Read Luke 1:5-25. Zechariah had been praying for a child possibly for years yet when an angel told him his prayer had been heard and would be answered he doubted. When you pray, do you expect answers? Why or why not? What can you learn from this event? What is God saying to you (use the "4 C" questions)?
- Day 2: Read Luke 1:26-38. With the coming of Jesus, the greeting given to Mary is now true for all who believe in Him. We are highly favored because God is with us! What reason did the angel give Mary for not being afraid? How can you apply that to your own life and fears? What is God saying to you (use the "4 C" questions)?
- Day 3: Read Luke 1:38, 57-66. In what ways might you be resistant to saying "I am the Lord's servant"? What are the reasons for the resistance? Can God be trusted even if following him might be a hardship? What is God saying to you (use the "4 C" questions)?
- Day 4: Read Isaiah 55:8-11. In Sunday's message, 3 reasons were given for trusting God. This passage was one of those reasons. What reason is given for why we can and should trust God? Have you ever questioned, disobeyed, or ignored the instructions God gives in the Bible, what is God saying to you (use the "4 C" questions)?
- Day 5: Read Psalm 34:1-10. The phrase "Taste and see" has the meaning of "give God a try." What reasons are given for trusting God and giving Him a try? What is God saying to you (use the "4 C" questions)?
- Day 6: Read Deuteronomy 31:6-8. Jesus is Immanuel which means "God with us." What reason do these verses give for trusting God? When you're feeling discouraged or challenged, what can you do to remind yourself that God is with you? What is God saying to you (use the "4 C" questions)?
